The ABCs of Mining Exploration

Where to Find a Mineral Deposit: Part 2

The article in the previous newsletter (September 2022) presented the first step in the business of mineral exploration, the acquisition of titles (claims). It is understood that the acquisition of claims is carried out following the study of historical and scientific data in the sector. It is only when they are acquired that the company is authorized to carry out exploration work.

The Mining Act requires that the company acquiring the titles send a notice within 60 days of the acquisition to the municipality concerned. In addition, 30 days prior to the beginning of exploration activities, a notice of work must be sent to the municipalities and Indigenous communities concerned.

The purpose of mineral exploration is to identify mineral resources. It allows the verification and the existence of the deposit all while evaluating its significance and quality. Work begins with basic exploration to identify a potential zone (mineral showing) and to confirm its grade (gram/tonne) and continuity. Subsequently, advanced exploration will allow us to evaluate the economic potential in a preliminary manner. Numerous work methods are used to carry out these two levels of exploration.

The first work is generally a geophysical survey to locate anomalies in the bedrock that may indicate the presence of a potential deposit. The field team then conducts trenching and drilling to observe the rock. The samples collected are sent to analytical laboratories for mineralurgical and metallurgical testing. As exploration is very expensive, the duration of the exploration is very variable and depends on the availability of financial resources.

It also depends on the data previously available. As mentioned in the previous newsletter, some projects are developed on old mines that are currently closed. These projects allow us to have much more information at the outset, thanks to historical data compared to a project where no work has been carried out.

In most projects, this exploration phase will take more than four years. Following basic and advanced exploration, a preliminary economic assessment of the deposit is performed. If this evaluation is positive, the project proceeds to the development stage.
